Toy D. Robinson is the System Program Director, Global Combat Support System-Air Force (GCSS-AF). The GCSS-AF program provides many capabilities of great value to the warfighter, primarily within the Operations Support mission area, which include: the Air Force Portal; the security layer which provides Information Assurance (IA) Controls and Reduced Sign On (RSO) for over 350 external applications, data services, and the application hosting environment for approximately 23 combat support areas that map to the functional areas defined in the Agile Combat Support (ACS) Concept of Operations (CONOPS). ACS provides the support foundation and integration within and between the six Air Force Operational CONOPS: Global Mobility, Global Strike, Global Persistent Attack, Nuclear Response, Space and C4ISR, and Homeland Security. Manages the execution of the GCSS-AF program totaling almost \$100M/yr. Directs a diverse team of

engineering, management and Operation & Support staff that includes a Prime Contract system integrators, a program office of Military, Civilian, A&AS support staff, DISA and MITRE, located across 5 separate and distinct geographic locations.

Mr. Robinson was commissioned a second lieutenant through the Air Force ROTC program in 1983. He served as a communications-computer engineer on active duty until a medical retirement in 1989. He renewed his Air Force career as a civil servant beginning in 1991.
