Mr. Timothy C. Nixon is Director, Business Sustainment Systems Division, Air Force Program Executive Office Business Enterprise Systems, Life Cycle Management Center, Air Force Materiel Command, Maxwell Air Force Base, Gunter Annex, Alabama.

Mr. Nixon began his Air Force career after receiving his commission through the Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) in May 1979. He became an Intercontinental Ballistic Missile (ICBM) combat crew member and spent the next eleven years in ICBM as a commander, instructor, evaluator, command post controller, and Strategic Air Command's senior test manager for Minuteman missiles. In July 1990, he transitioned into acquisition through the Education with Industry Program and was assigned to the Propulsion System Program Office (SPO) at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base.

Mr. Nixon spent the next four years in three different SPOs in the Aeronautical Systems Center and in April 1995, was assigned to the Air Force Materiel Command's Inspector General Office as Chief, Program Management. In October 1996, Mr. Nixon moved to the Joint Logistics Systems Center (JLSC) serving in a variety of program management positions. Upon his retirement from active duty, Mr. Nixon worked as an acquisition contractor for Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) and USAF.

In November 2000, Mr. Nixon entered the Civil Service work force and has held several program management positions within Depot Maintenance, Financial Systems, Business Systems and Enterprise Services.

Mr. Nixon holds a master's degree in operations management from the University of Arkansas and a bachelor's of business administration from the University of Montevallo. He and his wife, Anne Marie, have four grown children.
