





The AFIPPS program will be managed at Air Force Materiel Command (AFMC) Air Force Life Cycle Management Center (AFMC/AFLCMC) under the AFPEO for Business & Enterprise Systems (BES). The Functional Manager is Air Force Manpower and Personnel (A1) along with Secretary of the Air Force (SAF) Deputy Assistant Secretary for Financial Operations (FM). The Functional Management Office (FMO) represents the collaboration of A1 and SAF/FM, with AF/A1 as the overall lead. The Milestone Decision Authority (MDA) for AFIPPS is the Office of the Secretary of Defense (OSD) Deputy Chief Management Officer (DCMO).




